

Before you begin

The first time you dock your iPhone or iPod touch, you'll be prompted to download the free app "Acoustic Research N-able" from the iTunes store. You are encouraged to download and install this app (right on your iPad/ iPhone/iPod) in order to enjoy the wide variety of features which are available with the app. Instructions on how to use the app can be found in the About section inside the app.

- App is for iPad, iPhone and iPod touch only (iOS 3.1.3 or higher).
- Note the Acoustic Research N-able App must be running and visible for proper operation of all the app features such as personalized alarms. Launch the app by touching the app icon on your iPad/iPhone/iPod either just before or just after docking.
- Refer to the User Guide found within the app for more detailed information.

Plugging in for power

 Connect the supplied power adapter to the unit's DC jack, and connect to a convenient wall outlet Refer to the "Clock" section and follow the instructions to set the

clock time.


Battery back-up operation

- This clock radio is equipped with a timekeeping system that is powered with battery (CR2025) (not included). The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless battery is installed.
- When normal household power is interrupted, or AC line cord is unplugged, the battery will power the clock radio to keep track of time and alarm settings programmed into memory.
- Normal operation will resume after AC power is restored so you will not have to reset the time or the alarm.

Note: It is recommended to replace the batteries at least once per year even if no power failures have occurred

To install the battery:

- 1. Remove the screw on the battery door at the bottom of the unit
- 2. Slide the battery door as the direction arrow indicates



- 3. Take note on the battery polarity and place a CR2025 battery inside.
- 4. Replace the battery door and install the screw

Power failure indicator

If you have not installed the button cell battery in the product, or the battery runs out while AC power is disconnected, all the settings (clock, FM presets, alarm) will be lost. After AC power is reconnected, the time on the LCD screen will flash to indicate that power was interrupted and you should readiust the time settings.



Clock

You can set the clock by synchronizing the unit with iPad/iPhone/iPod or set the clock manually.

Setting clock with time

- 1. Dock in iPad/iPhone/iPod.
- 2. Press and hold CLOCK.
- 3. The time on the LCD screen will flash for few seconds. Your clock is now set.

The time on your iPhone is provided by your mobile phone service. The time on your iPod is provided from iTunes during the last connection to your computer. Please note that it is possible to have up to 59 seconds time difference between the unit and your iPhone or iPod time

Setting clock manually

- 1. Press **CLOCK**,12h or 24h will be displayed. Press K or >> to select time format and press **CLOCK** to
- 2. The hour will flash. Press ⋘ or ≫I to set the hour and press **CLOCK** to confirm. Then the minute will flash. Press KK or >> to set the minute.
- 3. To save and exit the clock setting, wait for about 5 seconds or press **CLOCK** to save the time.

Wake function

Set wake time

- This unit allows 2 wake times to be set. 1. Press ALARM once to enable WAKE 1; press twice to enable WAKE 2; press 3 times to enable both WAKE 1 and WAKE 2; press ALARM the forth time to disable both Wakes.
- 2. After pressing ALARM once to enable WAKE 1, WAKE 1 icon (% , or 10) will flash. Press and hold **ALARM** to enter WAKE 1 setting
- 3. Press KK or >> I to set the hour.
- 4. Press ALARM to confirm and then minute will flash. Press KK or >> I to set the minute and press ALARM again to confirm. The time decrements or increments by a faster rate when you press and hold the button.
- 5. Press **K** or **≫** to select wake

6. Press **K** or **≫** to select the alarm volume from 00 to 31 and press ALARM to confirm

If Waking to Alarm (&, &) is selected:

• Be sure to set the volume level high enough to wake you up.

If Waking to RADIO (, 2) is selected:

- · You will wake up to your most recently tuned radio station.
- · Adjust the volume to your desired level.

If Waking to iPad/iPhone/iPod (18, 28) is selected:

- Adjust the volume to vour desired level. The last played file on the iPad/iPhone/iPod will be played when the wake function activates.
- 7. After setting WAKE 1, press ALARM twice to enable WAKE 2. When the WAKE 2 icon is flashing, press and hold ALARM to enter WAKE 2 setting mode. Follow step 3 to step 6 to set WAKE 2.

- If there is no iPod/iPhone connected, the alarm tone will sound instead even if Waking to iPod mode is selected.
- When the wake function activates, the corresponding wake icon will flash until the wake function is turned off. The icon will then stop flashing, and then will remain lit.

Turn off the wake function To silence the wake function momentarily:

 Press SNOOZE. The alarm will sound again when the snooze period (9 minutes) is over.

To stop the wake function:

• Press ON/OFF. The alarm will be on again the following day at the same

To disable the wake function completely:

• Press ALARM repeatedly until no corresponding wake indicator (% , 🗖, 10 or 🐎, 🗹, 20) shows on the display.

Snooze

This operation allows extra sleep time after the wake function is on. The "quiet" period is 9 minutes. Snooze function can be used repeatedly up to 1 hour. After this, the wake function will turn off until the next day.

Sleep function

In the sleep mode, the radio, iPod or AUX mode can be set to operate for a certain period of time before turning off automatically.

To set the sleep time:

- 1. Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to cycle among the sleep time available (90min, 60min, 30min, 15min and
- The icon **T** flashes while selecting.
- 2. When the desired sleep time is selected, release SLEEP and wait for about 5 seconds, the sleep time is now set.
- The icon Tights on the display.

To change or check the remaining time in sleep mode:

· Press SLEEP once to check the remaining sleep time. Press SLEEP repeatedly to select another sleep time

To turn off the unit before preset

• To turn off the unit beofre the preset time, press ON/OFF or press SNOOZE.

To disable the sleep timer

• To disable the sleep timer and keep the unit playing, press SLEEP repeatedly until OFF is displayed.

Radio

Listening to the radio To turn on or off radio:

- 1. Press ON/OFF. If you have selected AUX or iPod mode, then press **SOURCE** to select radio.
- The radio mode icon (🗖) lights on the display
- 2. Press ON/OFF to turn off the radio. or press **SOURCE** to select AUX or iPod mode.

To tune frequency:

- Press K or ≫I. The selected frequency shows on the display.
- · Press and hold to automatically search for the next available station.

Antenna

Extend the FM antenna on the rear panel to get the best reception.

When tuning in FM stations, you may notice that the station you are tuning can be well-tuned on two or three nearby points. Always tune carefully at the loudest and clearest point.

Station presets To store a station as preset:


- 1. Tune to a radio station.
- 2. Press and hold PRESET.
- · An available preset location (e.g. P1) shows on the display.
- 3. Press **K** or **≫** to select a desired preset location (1-10).
- 4. Press PRESET to confirm.
- · You can save up to 10 preset stations

To recall a preset station:

In radio mode, press PRESET. The last selected preset location (e.g. P1) will show on the display. Press K or >> I to select a preset station. After 3 seconds. the selected radio channel will play.


iPad/iPhone/iPod

Listening to iPod/iPhone To connect iPad/iPhone/iPod: Dock in your iPad/iPhone/iPod vertically.




Alternatively, you may dock in your iPad horizentally

1. Move the rear support piece backward




When moving the rear support piece it is recommended that you use two hands to ensure that even force while moving. Be careful not to apply force to the clock display when moving the rear support piece as this may cause damage to the display.

2. Put up the arm.



3. Rotate the connector down and lock



4. Be sure to move the rear support piece forward. Docking when the rear support piece is not in the correct position will place unnecessary, and possibly damaging strain on your connector.



5. Place your iPad horizontally into the recess and plug in the connector to your iPad.



6. To remove your iPad, repeat step 1 and then unplug your iPad from the connector. Unlock the connector and put back the arm to its original position.

To select iPod mode:

- Press **SOURCE** to select the iPod mode.
- The iPod mode icon (☐) will light.
- Playback from the iPad/iPhone/iPod starts automatically.

To control the playback:


- Press K or ≫I to skip to the previous or next file.
- Press and hold K or >> to search backward or forward.

To charge the iPod/iPhone:

You may charge the battery of your iPad/iPhone/iPhone through the universal dock for iPad/iPhone/iPod while the unit is turned off (standby mode) or in the AUX, Radio or iPod mode. Charging control should be operated on the iPad/iPhone/iPod.

Auxiliary source

Display brightness

To select auxiliary mode: 1. Connect your auxiliary source (e.g. mp3 player) to the AUX input iack at the back of the unit with an audio cable (not supplied).

- 2. Press SOURCE to select AUX mode. The word "AUX" will light.
- 3. Adjust the auxiliary player to midrange volume and adjust the master volume on the unit. Do not turn the volume of the auxiliary player too high as this may affect the sound quality. For other playback operations, control them on your auxiliary player.

Press **DIMMER** repeatedly to adjust the brightness level or turn off the back

When the unit is reconnected to the AC power, the display backlight will be readjusted. You can press DIMMER to adjust the brightness level again.
